

At our last luncheon meeting in October, our Treasurer Lydia Kanno reminded us of the hours and work that is done by the Republican Women on behalf of the Party, and its candidates. She encouraged us to get involved and stay involved especially with the upcoming 2024 elections. I thought I should write a brief overview and facts of the current status of Women in Congress.

Women in history covers so much ground. I would love to write about and honor the women of the past, and present, but for writing in this newsletter we need to focus on a specific area, women in politics. Republican women fundraise, canvas, work on behalf of candidates, support both financially and physically, and the list goes on as you well know. Women will continue to have a major impact on history, and in the political arena even though we are underrepresented, and undervalued. I might add underestimated as well.

Present: 118th Congress

In both Chambers, there are 109 Democratic and 44 Republican women (153) (Pew Research Center). A record number of women are currently serving in the House (128), 28% of all members of the 118th Congress. In the Senate, 25 women are currently serving. 16 Democrats and 9 Republicans. (Rutgers) Women account for 43% of House Democrats and 31% of Senate Democrats, compared with 16% of House Republicans and 18% of Senate Republicans. Counting both the House of Representatives and the Senate, women account for 153 of 540 voting and non-voting members of Congress.

Interestingly enough, until the 1929 stock market crash, most of the dozen women elected to the House were Republicans, and for several decades afterward. During this time, the two parties' numbers were generally close in that chamber. The gap started widening in the 1970s and has persisted. As of March 2023, there are 42 Republican women serving in the 118th Congress, which is a new record high. This number includes 33 Republican women serving in the U.S. House (highest number ever) and 9 Republican women serving in the U.S. Senate. This representation is below the women's share of the overall population. That being said, the 118th Congress is the most racially and ethnically diverse in history.

A Bit of History Trivia: 1) The first woman to get elected, and serve in Congress was Montana Republican Jeannette Rankin, elected to the House in 1916. This was two years after her state gave women the vote. But women only began serving in more substantial numbers in the past few decades. (1992 to present). 2) 'Widow's succession' in Congress went on well into the 1970s, which was one of the most common ways for a woman to enter Congress was by succeeding her deceased husband or father, either by election or appointment. Less common in U.S. Congress than it used to be.

The gradual increase in the number of women serving generally parallels with the expansion of women's role in broader society, and we see more women in major political positions. Even though we are underrepresented, Republican women continue impact policy, serve in key positions, and provide invaluable contributions to our nation. **We are making progress**.

An interesting conversation to have with our fellow Republicans (especially women), would be why Republican women fall behind the Democrat women in the political arena? How do we address this and what change/s need to happen? 
THANKSGIVING FUN FACTS:
