Mike Conklin Chairman and CEO Sentinels of Freedom

The idea for Sentinels for Freedom began with our founder, Mike Conklin, whose son Kris was wounded in Iraq. While visiting Kris in the hospital, Mike spoke with others who were also wounded. It when then that he realized the tremendous physical and emotional hurdles these war-torn men and women faced when transitioning back to civilian life.

Conklin established Sentinels of Freedom as a 501(c)(3) nonprofit organization in 2007. Its mission is "...to provide severely wounded or injured post-9/11 veterans with comprehensive personal support and financial assistance as they complete their higher education and achieve success in their post-military careers. We are meeting our national responsibility as citizens to support those severely wounded veterans who have served and sacrificed to defend our freedom."

Americanism

When asked if I would be willing to be the CFRW Chair for Americanism, I thought since I had taught history, I could do this. Shortly into this conversation we realized we had taught students about the foundational principles, and characteristics of Americanism, such as ideas of individual rights and freedoms, what a representative democracy was and meant for us. We talked about the spirit of the nation at that time, the impact of American art and literature, but not actually used the term Americanism.

If you go online, which most people do, Americanism is defined as: The set of beliefs, values, and customs that are characteristic of the United States and its people. It encompasses ideals such as individual freedom, democracy, equal opportunity, and the pursuit of happiness.

But, Americanism can mean different things to different people.

My next thought was to actually talk with people whom I know to hear how they expressed, termed what Americanism meant to them. These are some of their responses.

- Knowing I have the freedom to pursue opportunities for personal, and economic growth of my choice. To make something of myself.
- To worship freely the religion of my choice.
- With the blessing of living in this country, as Americans we have responsibilities. We have a duty to be informed citizens and vote.
- To demonstrate loyalty to community and country.
- My daughter stated an example of Americanism for her was the entertainer Jelly Roll. He
 recently testified before a committee in the Senate addressing the fentanyl crisis happening in
 the United States. She stated this is a convicted felon, who cannot vote, but has taken the
 opportunity to change the course of his life, and is now involved in giving back to this country, by
 addressing a very serious social issue we are faced with. To her he is patriotic because he truly
 cares about American citizens and the well-being of this country.
- A willingness to serve this country in military service, and acts of volunteerism.
- To have pride in nationality.
- Obeying the laws, paying taxes, serving on jury duty, being a responsible citizen.
- Upholding the Constitution of the United States, its amendments, and the Rule of Law.
- Americanism includes a national identity, cultural and social norms, and political ideologies.

There was an overall theme, key words that resonated and stood out to me with what Americanism meant to them.

- Opportunity
- Freedom
- Informed
- Rights
- Education



Why is it important to have an understanding of Americanism?

Americanism defines the United States, its national identity. It impacts our lives. Understanding our values, such as democracy, freedom, equality, and individual rights helps us comprehend the foundation on which this country was built.

Understanding Americanism to promote civic engagement: As informed citizens we are more likely to participate in activities such as voting, and activism. We are better equipped to make decisions that align with our values, and the principles of this country.

We need to understand Americanism for educational purposes: Learning about our history, political system, and culture provides us with a comprehensive view of our nation.

A quote by Theodore Roosevelt

"Americanism means the virtues of courage, honor, justice, truth, sincerity, and hardihood – the virtues that made America."

We need to understand Americanism to preserve democracy.

Some examples of how women have played a crucial role in shaping Americanism in history.

- Thanks to women like Susan B. Anthony, and Elizabeth Cady Stanton women have the right to vote with the passage of the 19th Amendment in 1920.
- Women are continuing to increasingly take on leadership roles in politics and making strides in business and entrepreneurship. (economics)

- Women have served and are serving in the military.
- Women have shaped education.
- Women have contributed to scientific and technological advances that have influenced American innovation.
