

## **CONGRESSMAN JOHN DUARTE**



Congressman John Duarte is a fourth-generation farmer, businessman, and Valley native who proudly calls Modesto, California home. Currently, Congressman Duarte is serving his first term in the 118th Congress as Representative of California's 13th District. He and his wife, Alexandra have run a farming operation of vineyards and orchards together in the Central Valley since 1989.

Congressman Duarte holds key subcommittee assignments across three committees, reflecting his diverse interests and expertise. Within the House Transportation and Infrastructure Committee, he serves as the Vice-Chair of the Subcommittee on Highways and Transit, playing a crucial role in shaping policies related to transportation infrastructure. Additionally, he serves on the Subcommittee on Railroads, Pipelines, and Hazardous Materials, where he works on issues concerning transportation safety and efficiency. Congressman Duarte is a member of the Subcommittee on Water Resources, focusing on water management and related infrastructure projects. In addition, he serves on the Subcommittee on Energy and Mineral Resources, addressing matters related to energy production and mineral extraction.

Through his work on the House Committee on Agriculture, Congressman Duarte brings his expertise to the Subcommittee on General Farm Commodities, Risk Management, and Credit, examining policies concerning agricultural commodities and financial support. The beginning of the formation of political parties (political factions) in America goes back to when the founding fathers struggled over ratification of the federal Constitution. There were discussions, dissent, disagreements, and differences over ideologies. For example, how much power the federal government should have vs. state. Their differences of opinions were not necessarily a difference of principles and did not make them less committed to doing what was right for this country and its citizens. Political Parties have evolved over time, changing their names, responding to changes in society, issues, and shift in public opinion. I will focus on a general overview of political parties.

Political Parties are organized groups of people who share common goals, ideologies and fundamental concerns about how a society should be governed and how resources and power should be allocated. Political Parties are important in our democratic governance and play a significant role in shaping political outcomes. Political Parties provide a way for citizens to participate in the political process, express their preferences, and influence policy decisions through collective outcomes.

These are areas where political parties play a significant role.

- Elections: Parties nominate candidates for political offices. They mobilize voters and compete for support in elections. The political parties are competing for control and political power.
- Organizational Structure: `Parties have local, regional, and national organizations. The organizational structures include leaders, officials, activists, and members.
- Political Representation: Parties represent different segments of society based on factors such as ideology, socioeconomic status, ethnicity, and regional interests. They aim to reflect and advocate for the interests of their supporters.
- Legislative influence: Parties negotiate and collaborate to pass legislation, influence and promote policy decisions.
- Actions on the part of their leaders and /or leadership.

Political Parties will face debate, criticism and scrutiny over their platforms. Their platforms outline their beliefs, principles, and policy proposals on various issues. Examples include domestic issues, education, foreign policy, economics, immigration, and health care.


