Pastor Michael Douglass is a veteran broadcaster, speaker, and community pastor from our Central Valley. He is best known as the host of *The Mike Douglass Show* on KFIV 1360, and for his work with the nonprofit Advancing Vibrant Communities.

As host on his radio show, he provides commentary on current events and conversations about issues affecting the Central Valley. He has conversations with listeners who call in.

With over 35 years of experience, Douglass is an inspirational speaker, master of ceremonies, and voice-over specialist.



As President, CEO, and co-founder, Mike lead the non-profit Advancing Vibrant Communities. It connected faith-based volunteers to service opportunities in their local communities. The organization became active in June of 2002. He also serves as an Associate Pastor at Sherwood Bible Church in Modesto.

In addition to Mike's pastoral and media work, he has had an extensive career, including: Experience in law enforcement; serving with the State of California Governor's Office of Emergency Services as Assistant Chief for Urban Search and Rescue and Deputy Chief for Fire and Rescue; Pursuing a Ph.D. through Trinity College and Seminary in Indiana; Authoring the book *Speaking Your Way to Success* in 1995.

5 Facts About Veterans Day

It honors all U.S. veterans. This holiday celebrates men and women who have served in the U.S. armed forces, both living and deceased, across all eras and conflicts.

It was originally Armistice Day. The holiday's original name, Armistice Day, was established in 1919 to mark the anniversary of the armistice that ended WWI on November 11, 1918.

The name changed to Veterans Day in 1954 by President Eisenhower.

The holiday is recognized internationally. Other countries that were allies in WWI such as Canada, Australia, and Great Britain, also commemorate their veterans around November 11th.

The military men and women who serve and protect the United States come from all walks of life; they are parents, children, grandparents, friends, neighbors and coworkers, and are an important part of their communities.

Here are some facts about the veteran population of the United States:

- During the 2022 midterm elections, around a fifth (21 percent) of the candidates for U.S. Senate, U.S. House or governor claimed some degree of military experience.
- 10 percent of living veterans are women.
- 5.9 million veterans served during the Vietnam War.
- 7.8 million veterans served in the Gulf War era.
- 933,000 veterans served during the Korean War.
- Of the 16 million Americans who served during World War II, about 119,550 were still alive as of 2023.
